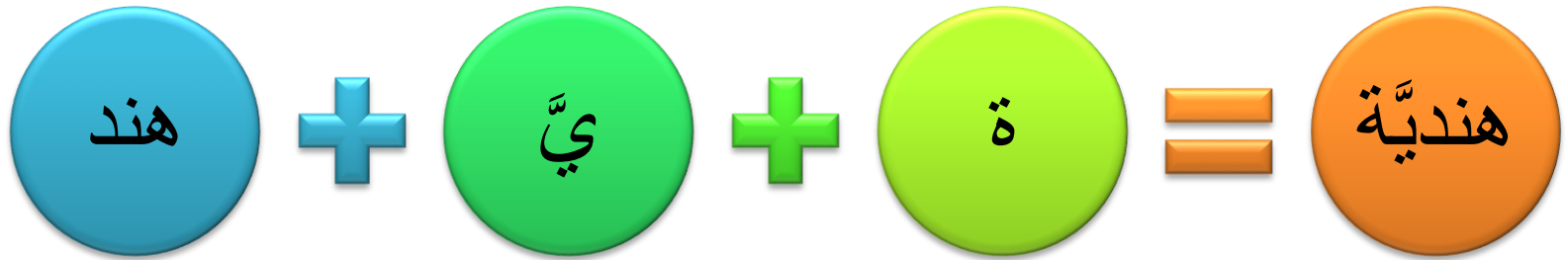

The word “how” in English can be you as part of a greeting. Same thing exists in Arabic, where we use the word how to ask someone their state.

كيف حالك؟



بخير، الحمد لله.

This expression is made up of three parts? In second person these parts are:

Second Person attached pronouns

When we attach the letter (ك) to a word we indicate a referent in the second person.

Your

ك

كتابك

Book-Your

Second Person attached pronouns

However, we have seen that the word “you” is represented by the following pronouns depending on the gender and number of referents in question.

You singular masculine

أَنْتَ

You singular feminine

أَنْتِ

You dual

أَنْتُمَا

You plural masculine

أَنْتُمْ

You plural feminine

أَنْتُنَّ

Second Person attached pronouns

As such the (ك) will also be inflected differently to reflect the different referents .

أَنْتَ	كَ

أَنْتُمَا	كُمَا + مَا
أَنْتُمْ	كُم + م
أَنْتُنَّ	كُنَّ + نَّ
